Did you know that...

- 2,333 teachers, directors and family child care providers living in the State participated in the T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® Project in fiscal year 2023? There were 947 child care programs that sponsored their employees returning to school through this scholarship program.
- programs receive ongoing help through on-site assessments and technical assistance in order to provide the highest quality services for children and family? In fiscal year 2023, **4,605** classrooms serving children birth to five in North Carolina received technical assistance through a child care resource and referral agency.
- 5,376 child care centers and family child care homes are in North Carolina?

- Head Start provides a range of services for children and families, including classroom settings and home visiting? In North Carolina, **443** sites provided Head Start services in fiscal year 2023.
- to be accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) means that a program has voluntarily chosen to meet higher national standards related to teacher education and programmatic standards? In North Carolina, **111** child care centers are accredited by NAEYC as of March 2024.
- 2,629 child care centers enroll children birth to three years old and 3,706 child care centers enroll children 3 to 5 years old in North Carolina?
- 987 family child care homes enroll children birth to three years old and 881 family child care homes enroll children 3 to 5 years old in North Carolina?
- on-going professional development ensures that teachers continue to strengthen their skills in providing early care
 and education to children? In North Carolina, 20,215 early educators participated in professional development
 activities in fiscal year 2023 provided by or through a child care resource and referral agency.
