Infant and Toddler Care in North Carolina

- Approximately 241,548 infants/toddlers in North Carolina live in families where their sole or both parents work.
- 2,772 centers and 1,205 homes in North Carolina provide early care and education to infants and/or toddlers.
- In February, 63,977 infants/todders in North Carolina were enrolled in centers. This number compares to 64,532 enrolled in centers prior to the pandemic*.
- In February, 2,656 infants/toddlers in North Carolina were enrolled in family child care homes. This number compares to 3,299 enrolled in homes prior to the pandemic*.
- 65% of infants/toddlers in North Carolina are enrolled in high quality care (at 4- and or 5-star rated center or home).
- Market rates in high quality programs in North Carolina are as follows:

The market rate is obtained through a survey administered to all child care providers statewide. Though market rates do reflect a higher cost of care for younger children, at all age groups, they only reflect what parents can afford to pay, not the true cost of care.

- 41% of children (birth through 5) in North Carolina receiving subsidy are infants/toddlers.
- The infant/toddler teaching staff make on average \$11.00 per hour compared to the three to five year old teaching staff who make on average \$12.45 per hour.
- Infant/toddler teachers and assistants tend to have less education than their counterparts teaching three to five year olds. Fifty-three percent (53%) of the infant/toddler teaching staff have an associate degree or more in any field compared to 69% of three to five year old teachers.
- *February 2020 data reflect pre pandemic numbers.
